Never saying much, 'The Stunner' won over the hearts of many a crowd over the years, one must attribute this success to his amazing ability in the ring, drawing on all aspects on the sport of professional wrestling, From his muscular physique to his seemingly endless 'in ring' stamina, Hannes was an out and out athlete. Hannes seldom missed a training session, coming straight from gym to the Wrestling academy he would be the first in and the last out of the AWA ring. Even when he was the only heavyweight at training he would spend time with each and every trainee transferring his vast knowledge to those new to the sport. 'The Stunner' was passionate about the future of South African Professional Wrestling, inspiring and criticizing the next wave, making sure all wrestlers were on a sufficient level to put on the best possible show. His loss at such a young age may lend people to believe that he was not yet able to truly give back to the sport, however it is a indication of the man that each and every wrestler on the AWA roster can attribute something about their style, move set, technique or ring physiology to the efforts of 'The Stunner'.
